Summary of 2017

In 2017, we received an outpouring of support from our community near and far, with friends new and old who believed in us and our mission. We are excited to report that we received a total of \$6,102.14 in the calendar year in donations! Of this total, \$4,504.48 were cash donations and \$1,597.66 were Gifts in Kind.

Additionally, in 2016, we secured a loan of \$1,285.00, which has covered many of the necessary expenses incurred to start and begin to run a new organization. While the loan was supplied in 2016, we were able to apply the remaining balance of \$638.58 to our operating expenses in 2017.

We were able to maintain a positive cash flow by year end 2017 of \$1,253.73 by keeping our total expenses to \$4,848.41. The expenses, detailed below, included \$1,679.97 that went directly to our Gear U.P. initiative and \$524.86 that went directly to our Food U.P. initiative!
