Letter from the Founder

Dear Friends,

First and foremost, I sincerely apologize for the lateness of this report. As we swiftly moved into the year of 2022, World U.P. got swept up expanding Mobile Produce Pantry (MPP) operations. Before I knew it, summer was upon us and the thought of writing about 2021 was overwhelming and difficult. However, as always, I'm frequently reminded that lasting and impactful change is the impact of consistent work year after year. World U.P. can only accomplish our goals because of the generosity of our donors. So, as I now, finally, take the time to reflect on 2021, I hope that my memory can deliver the details and my words can deliver the message clearly to you, that YOU, dearest Supporter are responsible for Building your World U.P.

As a primarily volunteer-based organization, we have been able to keep our salary-based overhead low. As a humanitarian organization that prioritizes people over profit, I know it is important to our financial donors to see their money used responsibly. As we doubled the number of monthly distributions and took on several new partnerships, our volunteers made it possible to assure that the grant funding and individual financial contributions we received were allocated to directly support programming of the Mobile Produce Pantry. Because of our volunteers, your contributions allowed us to purchase produce and other necessary supplies to ensure that our Pantry could reliably serve our clients month after month.

I'd like to acknowledge the three Program Managers I had the pleasure of working with in 2021! We entered 2021 with many ambitions but faced with the challenges of building sustainability around our growth. Mid-2021, Ever Bautista, was provided the wonderful opportunity to take a full-time, salaried, benefitted position elsewhere. We will be forever grateful for the time and energy he spent devoted to our MPP over the year he served as our first Mobile Produce Pantry Program Manager. His transition out of the role, left us with the daunting challenge of trying to find a new Program Manager. During that process, long-time volunteer, Marie Bonenfant, graciously stepped up as Interim Program Manager, and did an amazing job of keeping us operational. By the end of summer 2021, after multiple candidate interviews, we were lucky enough to bring on the current MPP Program Manager, Danah Slaughter. Danah's entrepreneurial spirit, creative mind, and "get things done" attitude has pushed the MPP beyond my expectations and allowed us to consider new avenues for program growth in 2022.

The diversity of these three Program Managers have proven that the passion for our mission lives beyond demographic, and within the human mind.

In addition to almost doubling our 2020 impact, in 2021 we were able to purchase a New (to us) truck, that's dedicated to our MPP programming (thanks to a generous donation by our long-time partner Feed More). This new truck has given Danah and the MPP the autonomy to grow even further and serve our partners in new innovative ways! Second, we were able to end the year with a highly successful direct mail campaign generating an additional ~\$1,000 in year end donations, so thank you to those who participated in that event!

Of course, this story doesn't end here. The end of 2021 ushered in the beginning of a new chapter – 2022. While I don't want to provide spoilers to next year's (much timelier) impact report, I can tell you it's been filled with media attention, new grant partners, return of previous grant partners, and the development of new programming opportunities. All of which is only made possible by you!

Your generosity powers our mission – to build our World U.P. with programming that promotes Understanding & Peace.

FY2021 Financial Report

Upon solidifying the development of the Finance Committee in 2020, in 2021 the team placed a strong emphasis on building a solid financial foundation for not just the coming year, but for the many years to come.

In light of this effort, the Finance Committee shifted its focus towards analyzing World U.P.'s current revenue streams and developed a sub-committee centered around Grants Funding. The Grants Committee is designed to identify untapped donor pools and potential partnerships for World U.P. to secure larger capital long-term and ultimately grow our programming into new areas.

78% of annual budget allocated to MPP programming



2021 also allowed World U.P. to take next steps towards expanding the Mobile Produce Pantry's (MPP) impact as the team secured our first truck thanks to our friends at Feed More. As we continue to optimize our workflows, in 2021 World U.P. was able to allocate over 78% of our annual budget towards the MPP and programming, with just around \$6,000 spent towards operations (22% of operating budget). In the past year, we are proud to share the MPP was able to conduct over 50+ distributions and serve over 30,000 pounds of produce to the greater Richmond community!

It's crazy to think World U.P. has crossed the five-year mark since its original inception and Year six (6) shows no signs of stopping. As the Finance Committee looks to secure additional sources of funding, the greater team continues to explore the ideas of new initiatives to better support our community through education, health & wellness, and food security.
